#### Y11 Geography Drop-Down Day - Tuesday, 16th April

On Tuesday 16th April, Y11 Geography students will be taking part in a drop-down day between periods 1 and 5.

During this time, students will be given the pre-release exam material, which presents a topical UK-based geographical issue. Students will spend the day with the Geography staff reading, highlighting, annotating and understanding the geographical issue that has been presented in the material. The drop-down day is a great opportunity for the Y11 students to be able to question, understand and have discussions around the issue presented and discuss what questions may be asked during the exam

The content of the pre-release material will then be examined in their Paper 3 exam in June. The questions relating to the pre-release material account for 15% of their overall grade.

It is incredibly important that all Year 11 Geography students attend this session.

#### Y11 - MFL Speaking Tests

GCSE Speaking tests are fast approaching for our Year 11 French and Spanish students. They **start on Wednesday 17th April.** Here are some top tips for them to help with their revision:

- For the chosen presentation topic:
  - chunk your learning and focus on learning one sentence at a time
  - If your teacher has made an audio recording for you, listen to this to perfect your pronunciation
  - Practice saying it aloud to anyone who will listen, or even to yourself!
  - If there's a tricky bit that refuses to stick, take it out! As long as the sentence still makes sense this is fine.
- For the Key Questions:
  - Read over the answers you have prepared and try to remember key verbs and structures to use in each one
  - extend your answers and add further detail with and. but, also, because
  - Make sure your knowledge of tenses is strong.
    Use your revision flashcards for this.

Remember that **little and often works best** when learning a foreign language. If your child has not started revising for this exam yet, please encourage them to start as there is too much for them to learn if they try to cram it all into the night before.

### V&A Innovate Challenge Awards Day 19 March 2024, Victoria & Albert Museum, South Kensington


On Tuesday 19th March The V&A in London hosted their 2023-24 Innovate National Schools Challenge Pitching and Awards Day. Kelvin Hall's year 9 team (Jack G, Charlie S, Chloe S and Vutechi O) was shortlisted out of 226 UK teams that entered the competition, we were one of only two Northern teams to be shortlisted!

On the day, we took part in creative workshops with artists and designers and saw the students' work on display. Our team prepared and stood up in front of a full auditorium to showcase their design ideas to a panel of well-known industry judges. The judges consisted of Jay Blades - BBC presenter of The Repair Shop, Victoria Jenkins - Fashion Designer of Unhidden Clothing and Camille Walala - Mural Artist.

We were the last pitch of the day and had some really tough competition.

The students spoke with confidence and explained a thought-provoking idea outlining an accessible sports hub that incorporates digital tech tools to make playtime more accessible for all students. When we asked if the judges had any questions, Jay Blades himself responded with "Not a question just a statement from me on this; you should be in power, you're doing stuff that that the people in charge should be doing for us, so hats off to you, thank you."

Upon much deliberation, the judges decided that Kelvin Hall was the winner of our category! This was a momentous accomplishment and all received a trophy, photographs with the judges, and a well-earned Five Guys meal before the long journey back home to Hull.
