Year 10 Work Experience Feedback - Celebration

During work experience, a group of students on a business project were asked to develop a name for a self-harm and suicide prevention service. The students suggested the name 'Blossom' and gave a presentation outlining why they had chosen the name, also creating possible logos.

Jo Kent, the Project Lead, came into school on Friday to thank the students and let them know that their involvement has helped Jo and her team to secure National Lottery Funding to launch 'Blossom' a self-harm and suicide prevention service in our area.

The students have been invited to be involved in the final logo design and the pilot training session for young ambassadors, giving their feedback and helping to tailor the training for young people. The students will also be invited to the launch in Princes Quay and offered volunteer opportunities with the service.
