Re: Year 11 Extended Options Days

As you know, Year 11 is an important year for your child and is crucial in preparing all students for their upcoming exams. The year is also important for making sure students have achieved their best in any coursework or practical assessments in qualifications that feature these aspects as part of their exam.

Achieving qualifications in a range of subjects represents a lot about a student. It demonstrates to colleges, apprenticeship providers, and employers, that a student has developed a breadth of knowledge across several subjects. This demonstrates that they have used effective studying, time management, and revision skills to balance the demands of studying a range of qualifications. At Kelvin Hall, we are proud that our students study a broad range of qualifications from English, Maths, Humanities, and Languages, as well as a broad selection of vocational subjects.

We are now in the final full term that your child will be at Kelvin Hall. As they have done all year so far, your child and their teachers will be working to ensure that any areas they need further support in, are developed in class, through revision sessions, and outside of school.
