Uniform Standards and Expectations

We also have lots of available uniforms on our 'new to you' rail and we are always happy to support parents and carers who may be struggling to provide uniforms for their children, please just get in touch.

Trousers shorts, and skirts - Trousers must be black, plain, full-length, and <u>must not be in a stretchy fabric</u>. Jeggings, leggings, chinos, and jeans are not allowed. Shorts and skirts must be tailored, black, and knee-length. Skirts may not be tight or in a stretchy material.

Jewellery - One small stud per lobe is allowed. A watch is allowed. All other jewellery is not allowed. This includes necklaces, rings, bracelets, body and facial piercings. Failure to comply with a request to remove jewellery will result in sanctions. No tattoos of any kind are allowed under any circumstances.

Hairstyles, Makeup and Nails - We allow natural makeup and accept a wide range of hairstyles. All we ask is that a student's hair is smart, and of natural colour. Eyelashes should be of natural appearance, false eyelashes are not allowed. Headscarves may be worn for religious reasons. They must be black, fastened securely, and allow for lanyards to be on display. Nails must be of a short, safe length. The school does not allow false nails.

Energy drinks and chewing gum - These items are not allowed in school. The rule on chewing gum is now even more important, as this can be dangerous to Lizzie, our school wellbeing dog.
