This week, the KHS Safeguarding team would like to bring awareness to WhatsApp, and a recent safeguarding concern that has arisen in schools across the UK, including local schools:

- → Children in our area are being added to a National group that currently has 800+ members:
- → The alleged aim is to "create the largest group in the world"
- → WhatsApp groups can have a max of 1024 members without adults being present
- → No way to verify that all group members are actually minors
- → General bad language and online bullying and harassment is present in this group
- → There is evidence of racist, homophobic, and sexually explicit language in this group
- → There is evidence of pornographic images / GIFS in this group
