#### Safety Messages - Dangers of Small Magnets

We would like to share some information with you about the danger of small magnets. A variety of different styles of magnetic items and fidget toys have become very popular and easy to purchase. There are also trends on social media in which young people are encouraged to use these as imitation piercings.

There have been a number of incidents in England in which students have ingested these small but very strong magnets, which has resulted in some children requiring surgery. If the magnets are ingested, they can attract in the body and compress parts of the intestines. This can cause problems with blood supply and lead to necrosis and perforation of the intestines or blood vessels. You can find more information about this on the NHS website.
