Dear Parents and Carers,

In November 2021, we invited all parents and carers to take part in a survey to give feedback on our students' daily experiences at Kelvin Hall School. The survey asked questions about how you felt the school was performing in key areas. We responded to the feedback from the survey in a [parental bulletin](#) in February 2022 detailing the progress we had made since. We grouped this into three key areas: student wellbeing and safeguarding, the curriculum, and the wider curriculum at Kelvin Hall.

This feedback was very valuable to us and it sparked lots of change at Kelvin Hall. This included physical changes to the building, new and additional staff, changes to our curriculum, and more. Some of these are highlighted below.

As a result of feedback from parents and students, we:

- appointed an additional member of the safeguarding team, the Deputy Designated Safeguarding Lead.
- expanded our student support team with several new roles.
- made the PE curriculum more gender-neutral.
- increased the amount of PSHE and SMSC taught during Focus Group lessons.
- increased the number of times we teach students about relationships and personal safety.
- used more external facilitators to support our teaching of Relationships & Sex Education.
- added more drop-down days to support students' personal development.
- increased the number of Careers events.
- modernised our CCTV system and improved the coverage and quality both within and without the school building.
- constructed an additional open-plan staircase for students.
- refurbished our PE changing rooms.
- refurbished student toilets to provide more private floor-to-ceiling toilet cubicles.
- changed our uniform policy to make it more inclusive.
- changed our curriculum plans and [our curriculum website](#).
- improved the way we communicate with parents, including regular communication through Arbor and a weekly home bulletin.

We are now asking you to complete the survey for this academic year. Your responses to the questions will give us invaluable information that we will again use to improve things in school for your child. There is also space for you to tell us about things you feel we do well, and things we could do better. You may wish to
