Dear Parents and Carers,

Yesterday, I was informed by Hull City Council of planned roadworks on Bricknell Avenue that are due to start on Monday 20th September. These works are part of the wider 'Hull to Cottingham HEY LEP Cycle Route' scheme. You can find more information about the scheme by clicking on the link below, I have also attached a letter from Hull City Council which we received on Thursday.

During the planned roadworks, there is likely to be disruption to travel along Bricknell Avenue and to the entrances of Kelvin Hall School and Wyke 6th Form College. We expect this disruption to include:

- Removal of road markings.
- Partial road closures.
- Closure of pedestrian crossings.
- Narrowing of footpaths.
- Rerouting of pedestrian traffic onto temporary footpaths.
- Disruption to the existing cycle lanes.
- Suspension of parking on Bricknell Avenue.

We know that this disruption is likely to cause some problems for our staff, students, and visitors. Please consider this disruption and make plans to ensure that your child can attend school, arrive safely, and arrive in time for their first lesson.

The school is working closely with Hull City Council and their contractors to ensure that the works do not impact the safety of our school community. The school has already made arrangements to place additional duty staff at the school entrances and we will speak to our students and staff about what they can do to avoid any problems.

I would also like to take this opportunity to remind you that parents are not permitted to enter the school car parks or to park on the shared access road with Wyke 6th Form College for school drop-off or pick-up. Due to the size of the school car parks it is not possible for vehicles to wait on the school site. This can lead to safety issues for our students and, in the event of an emergency, prevents access for emergency vehicles to Kelvin Hall and Wyke 6th Form College. I would like to ask all parents to respect this rule and to help us ensure the safety of our school community. If you have concerns about a mobility or access issue for your child, and you have not already made arrangements with us, please contact the school reception.
