Year 11 Parents/Carers at Kelvin Hall School,

As we are coming towards the end of Year 11's time at Kelvin Hall School, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for all for your support and for the hard work the students have put in and will continue to do so until the end of their assessments.

### Year 11 Leaving

We can confirm that Monday 24<sup>th</sup> May will be the final whole school assessment day for Year 11. Students will finish early on this day, leaving after their final Statistics assessment at approximately 12.55 to 1.20pm. Teachers will begin marking the assessments in the afternoon.

From Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> May to Friday 28<sup>th</sup> May 2021, the revised curriculum offer at Kelvin Hall School will consist of:

- **Remote home learning.** Teachers will set work throughout this week and the month of June 2021 on Google Classroom to support students and bridge the gap between school and post-16 education or work-based learning.
- **Catch-up assessments or additional lessons.** If we require further evidence from students towards their teacher assessed grades, students should be available to come into school up until and including Friday 28<sup>th</sup> May 2021. This may be needed in order for us to finalise the evidence teachers need in order to determine grades. Students will be informed individually if additional work is required before the school starts the internal moderation process.

From Monday 7<sup>th</sup> June onwards, **all** students will be on **remote home learning** as their assessments will have finished. Year 11 teachers will continue to set remote home learning through Google Classroom. There will also be the opportunity for students to participate in further enrichment activities in June to support their transition to post-16 learning. Details of these events will follow.

Additionally, the school will monitor and work with the careers team at Kelvin Hall to ensure students have the support needed as they move onto their post-16 opportunities. Erica Hood, our careers co-ordinator, will continue to work throughout the summer term, autumn term, and beyond if needed.

Teachers will be using the remaining weeks to standardise and moderate student work before an internal quality assurance of all the data takes place in early June, prior to submission to the exam boards on 18<sup>th</sup> June 2021. Teachers have and will continue to work hard to ensure Year 11 teacher assessed grades are a true reflection of the hard work students have put into their school life.





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In addition to the students' educational achievements, we would have normally spent the last 12 months planning the final chapter of their school life at Kelvin Hall School with:

- Their pre-planned external 'Public Exams'.
- Their graduation year group gathering.
- Their leaving Prom in 2021.

However, I am sure that all parents will realise that due to circumstances that are very much out of our control, the above events have not been able to take place. I would like to be clear that we feel it is indeed unfair that they have missed so much in the last 18 months in both their school and personal social life, and only they will know how that feels as an individual. There is nothing we can say as a school to make up for the time they have lost with their peers.

However, we would like to reassure you today, that as new guidance is emerging from the government, we are planning for results day as normal on the 12th August 2021. **We will endeavour to ensure this is a real celebration event of the hard work over the last five years and is a memorable event to say a proper goodbye to their friends and staff after they have receive their results.**

Under the circumstances, I would ask you to support your child to stay resilient in preparation for all of their future opportunities. My very best wishes on behalf of all the staff at Kelvin Hall School.
